

The focus for the **Third Sunday**, called "Gaudete Sunday" is **Cheer Up!** <u>We rejoice</u> as we are nearing the birth of Christ. This day the priest may wear

pink vestments, or rose, signifying rejoicing. Isaiah 35: 1 "...the dry land shall be glad...rejoice with joy and singing."

#### **Our Christian assignment:**

to help build and complete "the reign of God."

God chose John the Baptist to be the one through whom His saving plan for our salvation was to be revealed to the world. As the "advance man" for the Messiah, John's role was uniquely important. Like the ancient prophet Elijah who was God's messenger, John was sent to act as herald for "*He who is to come*."

We celebrate this fulfillment this very day because ... "Christ now appears in the midst of the poor as one of them; and He has taken them to Himself so that they are, in a most special way, *Himself*. What happens to them happens to Him"

So this Advent's celebration is a reminder that *the reign of God* is at hand, and that we are actively called to build up this reign, now, today, and whenever we take time for church or community service; whenever we frequent our seniors and their nursing homes; whenever we take time to *really listen* to and befriend our children in their sometimes confusing search for life and meaning; and whenever we do *anything* that is good! In God's own scheme of things, all these people make up "the reign of God," already in our midst.

Rejoice in the Lord always; for indeed, the Lord is near.

As we wait for the coming of the Lord, we prepare our hearts and homes to receive Him. As Saint Paul instructs, we prepare with patience and a firm heart. We will know He has come into our hearts and homes when we model true discipleship and work to bring the Good News to those around us.

In the first reading, the prophet proclaims the joyful news that God saves His people and gives them great reason for rejoicing. Saint Paul, in the second reading, exhorts the faithful to prepare for the coming of the Lord with patience and a firm heart. In the Gospel, John the Baptist asks if Jesus is really the Messiah, or should they seek another?
