As we near the end of Lent, we celebrate Passion (Palm) Sunday.

At the beginning of the liturgy, we receive palms in memory of Christ's



triumphal entry into Jerusalem. As a symbol of triumph, the palms point us toward Christ's resurrection and can remind us of the saints in heaven "wearing white robes and holding palm branches in their hands" (Rev 7:9) White robes remind us of baptismal garments, and the palms suggest their triumph over sin and death through the waters of Baptism. Bring the palms home, display them (perhaps in the form of a cross) until next year.

As a registered Separate school supporter, you have a say in who will represent your interests at the school board and other levels of government. You don't have to have children in a Catholic school to register as a Separate school supporter...you only have to be Catholic.
