The Feast of the Ascension, forty days after the
Resurrection, is the final act of our redemption which
began on Good Friday. On this day, the humanity of
Jesus is taken up into heaven, for he ascended bodily
into heaven. Yet the Ascension does not mean that
the ministry of Jesus, who bodily ascended, has come
to an end. No, the Ascension marks a new beginning,
a new era for the Christian community charged with
continuing the ministry of Jesus. This moment of the
Ascension is probably best described as a turning
point in the life of the Church. Most certainly not a
sad moment of despair and loss as we watch Jesus
leave and ascend into heaven, but rather a moment of
growing joy as we realize Jesus will continue to be
present, albeit in a new and unusual way. As Mark's
Gospel reminds us today, Jesus continued to work
with, and confirm the work of the Apostles, after his
Ascension (Mk 16:20).

Pentecost Sunday, No one who was gathered in the
upper room on Pentecost could have missed the
presence of the Holy Spirit. A strong, driving wind,
tongues of fire, and the apostles speaking in different
languages; it was clear that Jesus' promised of the
Spirit coming upon them had been fulfilled. Let's
take this opportunity today on this great feast to pray
for a greater outpouring of the Holy Spirit in our
lives. The gifts of wisdom, understanding counsel,
and strength: gifts of prophecy healing and
discernment of spirits.

Get on the voters list

Your vote is your voice. When you cast your vote, you're declaring your support of Catholic Education

On Oct 24th, 2022, make sure your voice is heard. Visit voterlookup.ca to confirm that your name in on the Preliminary list of Electors for the upcoming municipal and school board elections.

If you haven't declared your Catholic school support, by default your property taxes are directed to the municipality's English public school board. As a property owner in Ontario, you're entitled to direct your school support to English separate Catholic – which, in Hamilton, is the Hamilton-Wentworth Catholic District School Board.

As a registered Separate school supporter, you have a say in who will represent your interests at the school board and other levels of government. You don't have to have children in a Catholic school to register as a Separate school supporter...you only have to be Catholic.
