# February 12 - Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Settle with your opponent quickly while on the way to court. Matthew 5:25

Soon after Jesus began public preaching, he gave his famous Sermon on the Mount. He spoke about prayer, love, healing, discipleship and the law. In a very specific manner, he told his followers to settle their disputes with each other without having to go to court. He warned them the court and judge may give a strict judgment, a prison sentence and a severe fine.

Later, Jesus repeated this teaching saying that brothers should be able to resolve their disagreements or quarrels between the two of them. If they would need further help, they could invite a friend or someone from the church to listen and offer a solution. Numerous lawsuits about today; yet the wisdom of Jesus remains viable to challenge us to pursue a more peaceful and lasting solution to our disputes.
