#### <u> March 19 – Fourth Sunday of Lent</u>

Do not judge from his appearance. Not as man sees does God see, because man sees the appearance but the Lord looks into the heart. 1 Samuel 16:7

On this date nineteen years ago, a spiritual teacher of mine, Peter, died. He died alone and rather afraid in a care home for the impoverished. Born poor, raised poor, he also had medical and cognitive impairments that kept him on social assistance and in rooming houses all his life. He met Jesus in his middle age. And the light that had been hidden within him shone out, more brightly and more stunning each day. He touched the hearts of many, including me.

Who is spiritually blind? We are, whenever we, like the religious people in today's Gospel (John9), judge and reject another. Who is freed of such blindness? We are, whenever we, like the man born blind, judged unworthy and disowned by all, receive the touch of Christ and let him free us.

## <u>March 26 – Fifth Sunday of Lent</u>

When Jesus arrived, he found that Lazarus had already been in the tomb for four days. John 11:17. The story of the raising of Lazarus shows a moment when Jesus is most human and most divine. He is most human: he really loves Martha, Mary and Lazarus. When he sees the others weeping for Lazarus, he is "perturbed and deeply troubled" (verse 33). And when he stands outside the tomb of his good friend, he himself weeps, Such actions make us say of him, "He is truly one of us."

At the same time, the account powerfully shows Jesus' divinity. He prays to his heavenly Father, he calls Lazarus to come forth and a dead human being-now alive-stumbles out of a dark tomb still wrapped in his burial shroud. Some of the onlookers begin to believe in Jesus. But others run to the authorities to report what Jesus has done. The raising of Lazarus is the last straw: Jesus must be stopped, permanently.

Lord Jesus, you know best what we need to grow in faith, hope and love. As we observe this Lent through prayer, fasting and charitable works, may we be open to whatever gifts your Holy spirit offers us.
