Praying the Bible

Read the passage through, section by section. How does this Word speak to me at this time, in this context?

What emotions are evoked by the Word? How does this Word speak to me of God and how does it impact my life?

Conclude with a brief prayer of thanksgiving to the Holy Spirit.
