

JOIN THE MARCH FOR LIFE IN OTTAWA



Once again, Hamilton Right to Life has arranged for two buses to take you to the National March for Life in Ottawa on May 8 and 9.

This year's theme is <u>Protection at Conception</u> because human rights begin with human life begins at conception.

There is a scientific consensus on this matter. A survey done of over 5000 biologists found that 96% agreed that life begins at fertilization (or conception-the term mean the same thing).
