

May 25, 2025 – 6th Sunday of Easter

Today's gospel goes back to the Farewell Discourse at the Last Supper. Jesus speaks words we hear at every Mass: "Peace I leave you, my peace I give you." Jesus again speaks words of peace on Easter. Peace is one of the greatest gifts he gives. It is a sign of God's kingdom, God's reign – made present in Jesus' life, death and resurrection. God's peaceable kingdom is among and within us. But, oh, it is also very much still to come. We don't live in peaceful times. Sometimes, it's hard to imagine or hope for peace.

This Last Supper Gospel scene points us forward to Pentecost. Jesus speaks of the Spirit, the Advocate, sent by the Father in his name. the Spirit brings us every more deeply into the peace of Christ. We must trust that God's kingdom is breaking into our lives, that we have received its first fruits. We must share what we have received, and pray for God's kingdom of peace and justice to come more fully. As we live in the in-between time, when God's kinadom is already-but-not-yet, the Spirit is with us, bringing peace into our hearts and lives. And calling us to receive that peace and share it with others - to imagine and hope for peace, to work for it. Peace be with you.
